## What is a Title 32 Special District?

- O Title 32 Special Districts
  - O Local Government (Quasi-municipal)
    - Formed under Title 32 of the Colorado Revised Statutes
    - First authorized in 1949 by the General Assembly to provide certain municipal-type services in rural and unincorporated areas
  - Single Purpose District
    - O Water District
    - O Sanitary Sewer District
    - O Fire District
  - O Metropolitan District
    - Providing two or more specific services, including but not limited to: Domestic Water, Sanitary Sewer, Roadways, Irrigation Water, Park and Recreation, Transportation, Architectural Control, and Covenant Enforcement

### Why Special Districts Are Created

- New infrastructure is funded by those who will benefit (property owners and residents within the district)
- O Public infrastructure can be financed over time
- Property owners can deduct taxes paid to the district on their federal income tax returns
- Well-established revenue for long-term maintenance and operations of certain public improvements that are not dedicated to a municipality (public access)
- Sovereign immunity protections
- Formal government entity; governed by an elected Board of Directors





### Governance of the District

- District is an independent governmental entity; separate and distinct from municipalities
- O The District is **<u>not</u>** an HOA
- O Governed by an elected Board of Directors
- O Local municipality is not liable for debt or other obligations of a district
- O Not a government of general jurisdiction
- O No police power
- O No land use regulatory authority
- O Governmental Immunity

## Board Meetings (cont.)

- O Minutes
  - O An accurate record of all meetings must be kept
  - O Taken by hand or recorded, but must be transcribed
  - O Meetings can be recorded by the Secretary of the Board or a person designated specifically as Recording Secretary
  - O Official record can be maintained electronically
  - O Always open to public inspection

### Board Meetings (cont.)

- O Executive Sessions
  - O Should be noted on the meeting agenda, if possible
  - O Affirmative vote of two-thirds of the quorum required
  - O Chairperson must announce, and minutes must reflect, specific authority for entering executive session.
  - O Minutes must be electronically recorded and preserved for 90 days
  - O Legal Counsel may determine Attorney-Client privilege that is not recorded

#### Board Member Responsibilities/ Staff Responsibilities


#### **Board Officers**

- O Unless specifically authorized by the Board as a whole, no individual Board member - regardless of office - has any greater authority than another
  - O Speaking on behalf of the Board
  - O Making promises on behalf of the Board
  - O Directing staff on behalf of the Board
  - O Entering into agreements on behalf of the Board


#### Property Taxes

- Operations Mill Levy
- Debt Service Mill Levy
- Specific Ownership Tax This a property or ad valorem tax that is levied on a motor vehicle and is paid annually when the vehicle is registered within a county. Specific ownership tax is collected and distributed by each county to local governments.




#### <u>District Expense</u> Breakdown O&M





### **District Financing**


- Build infrastructure such as Parks & Rec., roadways, waterlines, non-potable pumps, sanitary sewer lines, stormwater facilities, landscaping
  - Phase 2A, 2C, & CR1 \$30M
- Operations and Maintenance of assets
  - Landscaping and non-potable system
    - District and HOA agreement
      - Reduce overhead costs
      - Reduce confusion for homeowners



### Service Plan Limits

#### Mill levy cap

- 50 mills adjusted for changes to residential assessment rate
- Debt cap
  - \$123,209,254 adjusted for inflation
- Length of debt cap
  - 40 years from date of issuance.



#### **District Debt**

Bonds (Issued by District No. 2, repaid by Nos. 2, 3, & 4)

- Senior \$32,760,000 (5.000 5.125%, 12/1/2047)
- Subordinate \$3,247,000 (7.625%, 12/15/2057)
- Junior Subordinate \$7,238,746 (6.000%. 12/15/2053)
- Discharged in 2057 regardless of whether paid in full
- Developer Notes (Issued by District No. 1)
  - Capital Note \$20,403,404 (6.5%)
  - Repaid only if funds are available.
